# Benefits of Due Diligence-Aligned Contracts

Benefits to companies of responsiblecontracting:

- Stronger risk management
  through greater supply chain transparency and resilience
- Improved stakeholder relationships with business partners, workers and communities
- Closer **alignment** with responsible business conduct standards
- Legal compliance
- Attracting investment
- Building consumer trust and loyalty
- Demonstrating ethical leadership

Contracts are essential for implementing HREDD and avoiding and/or remediating forced labor issues.

Examples of new legal requirements include:

- EU CSDDD & HREDDexpectations . E.g:
  - Obtaining contractual assurances from suppliers on HRE (CSDDD Art. 10, 11)
  - Obligation to adopt responsible purchasing behavior (CSDDD Art. 10, 11)
  - Termination of business only as a last resort (CSDDD Art. 10, 1)
- Riskmanagement systems and disclosures (EU Batteries Reg, Deforestation Reg, CSRD, ISSB)
- EU Forced Labor Regulation& US Tariff Act and UFLPA
